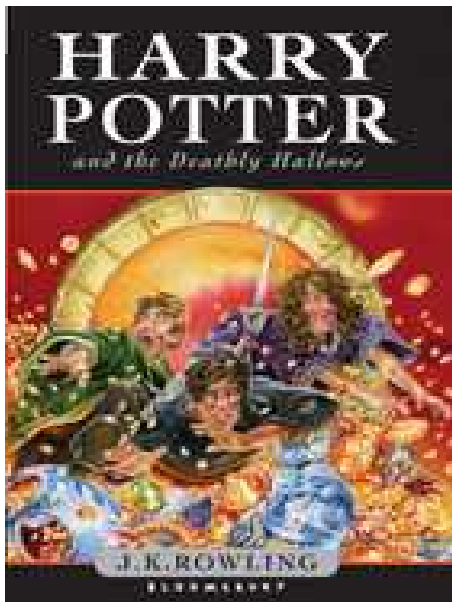
Year 8 Project in the CLC
