## Year 10 Business Studies Students Visit Sheffield Wednesday Football Club

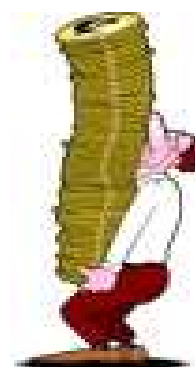
